The Pointer Club of Scotland held a ch show where BIS was Penwest Phineas at Kiswahili; RBIS, Juennerfly Angelica at Beridew; BP Wyndhead Mette Marit; & BV, Sh Ch Hurwyn Crepe Suzette.

VETERAN DOG (5,2a)

1. Wilson's Sh Ch Bonnygate Gunns a Blazing, 9 years b/w dog with superb angulation & shape, this well muscled dog moved with drive & enthusiasm;
- 2 McManus' Crookrise Wide Awake, b/w with all round good angulation, beautiful head & typical Pointer expression;
- 3 Black's Raigmore Endeavour.

MINOR PUPPY DOG (4)

- 1 Simmons Galema Highlander, this b/w puppy was just over 6 months on the day of the show & showed great showmanship & presence in the ring, a beautifully balanced head with a melting expression. Although very raw, his overall body shape was symmetrical & well angulated. Lovely shaped feet, a promising up & coming baby;
- 2 Kirby's Haramander Shabby Chic, very promising youngster of just over 6 months who was thoroughly enjoying his first official show. This o/w puppy moved with drive & confidence. Obviously still at a raw stage of development but has the shape and potential to be a star in the making;
- 3 Wilson's Bonnygate Kindred Spirit.

PUPPY DOG (3)

- 1 Wilkinson & O'Neill's Hurwyn Some Might Say, striking b/w with a very symmetrical, balanced body for his age, clean head, neck & shoulders, correct oval bone & tight feet, correct angulation, using his tail all the time when on the move;
- 2 Sellin's Aurichalcum Lord Becket of Castlepoint, lovely headed puppy with a beautiful kind expression. Although this dog had very similar attributes to 1 I felt he was slightly heavier over his shoulders;
- 3 Gordons Hawkfield Sunkissed Sea.

JUNIOR DOG (5,1)

- 1 Edmondson & Robertshaw's Crookrise Floyd, promising b/w, balanced head set on lovely long arched neck & clean shoulders, correctly shaped, well padded feet, straight front & correct angle to pastern, sound, driving movement, good length of tail, which he used on the move;
- 2 Heaton's Brackenstyle Ace, this o/w needs time to show his true potential, being a taller dog than 1 he needs to fill his frame more & I would like to see a lower tail carriage, although this did not detract from his movement & overall shape which won him his place;
- 3 Hamilton's Hawkfield Lets Get Rowdy.

YEARLING DOG (5)

- 1 O'Driscoll's Fowington Five Bob Note, compact b/w in excellent hard condition, classic head & expression, clean neck & shoulders, excellent angulation & driving action on the move, correct hard texture to coat. I am sure he will gain top honours as he matures;
- 2 Andrews & Ledger's Ledgands Magic N Mayhem, o/w with well balanced head, correct eye shape with that desirable dark melting expression you want to see in a Pointer. Bigger than some, he is another dog that needs time to mature, strong movement & symmetrical body shape, good tail carriage, with I found lacking in some dogs;
- 3 Adams-Heighway's Burslygrange Hugo.

- 1 Haramander Shabby Chic;
- 2 Aurichalcum Lord Becket of Castlepoint

- 1 Galema Highlander

GRADUATE DOG (6,2)

- 1 Barker's Flinthill Jordy Boy, b/w, tall so needs time to grow into his frame. Balanced head with long neck which flows into clean shoulders, deep chest & good body shape;
- 2 Ledgands Magic N Mayhem;
- 3 Burslygrange Hugo.

POST GRADUATE DOG (6,1)

- 1 Yeo's Trexon Tick Tack, a stunning lightly marked b/w dog with ring presence, lovely angulation with well balanced body & depth of chest, clean arched neck into well laid back shoulders, good sloping topline. RCC;
- 2 Boyd & Hinton's Fleurfields Flame for Glowmist, masculine b/w, well muscled & balanced shape when stood. Movement not as flowing as 1;
- 3 Klein-Woolthuis' Haxalgate Balach Dubh.

LIMIT DOG (8,1)

- 1 Walkling's Penwest Phineas at Kiswahili, I last judged this dog as a puppy & he has not disappointed me in his development. This l/w dog is masculine without coarseness, balanced head with good stop & dark eyes, well bodies with correct shoulder placement & angulation, deep chest, powerful action which he used on the move, in hard muscular condition. CC & BIS;
- 2 Yeo's Trexon Travellers Trick, l/w dog with pleasing head, good ear and eyeset, gentle expression & defined stop, lovely clean neck & shoulders. This dog won his placing on his strong movement & balance shape. Just preferred the slightly more masculine physique of 1;
- 3 Gordon's Hawkfield Dapper in Black.

OPEN DOG (6,1)

- 1 Kenny Taylor's Rodale Reflection at Highshann, mature l/w. solid dog with a deep chest & plenty of heart room, clean neck & shoulders, oval bone & tight feet, well muscled rear & good angulation. Just not as positive on the move when it came to the final challenge;
- 2 Barrs Gordon's Panoply Dancing Brave, very smart lightly marked b/w who moved with drive. I would have preferred slight more angulation overall, Good head & kind expression with correct eye shape & colour;
- 3 Nelis' Fowington Bruar of Freebreeze.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS DOG (2)

1 Wilkinson's Flinhill Jumping Jack, I found this b/w to be rather big all over, which gave the impression of heaviness, both in head & body. His overall body shape was good & shape of tail & tail carriage on the move were correct;

2 Anderson Rowell's Stormy Lenny, this b/w needs to develop & grow on. Does not have the substance of his counterparts. He has an attractive head with correct eye shape & positioning, preferred the tailset of 1.

VETERAN BITCH (7,1)

1 Wilkinson's Sh Ch Hurwyn Crepe Suzette, this 8 years o/w has lost none of her sparkle, I was so pleased to have the honour of judging her as I have always admired her. In superb condition, this very feminine headed bitch has a mature & well balanced body, covering the ground with little effort. BV;

2 Udale's Crookrise Fairy Tale, compact b/w with a classic Pointer head that was balanced & well chiselled, good angulation, tight oval feel, strong free flowing movement;

3 O'Driscoll's Fauloon Queen of Fowington.

FIELD TRIAL BITCH (3,1)

1 Blower's Bonnygate Just a Madam for Deadaway, she lived up to her name with excellent ring presence, a compact o/w with a kind expression & dark eye colour, in hard muscular condition, tight oval feet & correct oval bone;

2 Blower's Sharnphilly Wilma at Deadaway, taller l/w bitch. Good angulation & driving movement, in good hard condition.

MINOR PUPPY BITCH (8,2)

1 Blower's Bonnygate Karriage Queen (AI) very pretty b/w, short coupled youngster, beautiful kind expression, already showing a well defined stop, correct oval bone & straight front, carried her tail well, using it with vigour, good angulation, won this class on her steady movement & stylish action;

2 Turnbull's Bonnygate Krystal Roses at Beridew, there was very little between this bitch and 1 who I found later to be her litter sister. The only difference was that this bitch was not as settled on the move, but I am sure that they will regularly change places in the future;

3 O'Driscoll's Fowington Caracas

PUPPY BITCH (5)

1 Anderson Rowell's Wyndhead Mette Marit, what a stunning little girl. This 11 months o/w had the most melting expression, well balanced head with open kind eyes, clean neck & shoulders with straight front & sloping pasterns, short coupled & nicely developed for her age, moved with drive & confidence. Forgiven for fidgeting when standing as her quality was obvious. BP;

2 Nelis' Freebreeze Reflected Glory, very feminine puppy, b/w with well defined stop & correct ear & eyeset, arched neck into clean shoulders & straight front, good angulation & bend of stifle, lovely topline & short coupled;

3 Gordon's Hawkfield Sea Siren.

JUNIOR BITCH (9,1)

- 1 Tibb's Raigmore Let It Shine, this striking bitch took my eye when she came into the ring, superbly balanced hen standing & moved with purpose & drive, classic head with long clean arched neck & shoulders. Although still young she has all the true Pointer attributes required to be a Ch of the future. RCC;
- 2 Smith's Hawkfield Lets Cause Truble, compact b/w in excellent condition, well muscled rear action, with very good angulation & tailset, good expression;
- 3 Barrs Gordon's Panoply Golden Pearl.

YEARLING BITCH (8,1)

- 1 O'driscoll's Fowington Six In The City, really well muscled o/w with lovely dark pigmentation, plenty of heartroom with powerful rear action, tail correct length which she used on the move, correctly shaped feet & plenty of bone;
- 2 Critchley's Whipspan Bondi Peach, o/w with excellent head, overall shape is balanced with good depth of chest, straight in front & sloping pasterns, rear angulation is good but her rear action was not as positive as 1;
- 3 Hawkfield Lets Cause Truble.

MAIDEN BITCH (4)

- 1 Raigmore Let It Shine;
- 2 Bonnygate Karriage Queen (AI);
- 3 Critchley's Whipspan Nicole Kidman.

NOVICE BITCH (6)

- 1 Raigmore Let It Shine;
- 2 Hawkfield Lets Cause Truble;
- 3 Panoply Golden Pearl.

GRADUATE BITCH (10,3)

- 1 Barker's Flinthill Jenny Wren, well bodied b/w with good depth of chest, excellent bend of stifle & well let down hocks, steady on the move, balanced head with ample stop;
- 2 Tibb's Raigmore Quest, b/w with good angulation & movement. Not quite as mature as 1 but will come with time;
- 3 Yeo's Wilchrimane Desert Rose at Trexon.

POST GRADUATE BITCH (15,3)

- 1 Robertson's Keepersfield Highland Rose, short coupled b/w, compact & symmetrical in shape, well muscled showing ample second thigh, moved with precision & drive;
- 2 Wilson's Bonnygate Just Diana, attractive o/w, correct balance of foreface to skull, deep in chest with substance, powerful movement;
- 3 Udale's Crookrise Moonglow.

LIMIT BITCH (11,4)

- 1 Barker's Flinthill Wild Thyme, b/w with clean lines & excellent angulation, attractive well balanced head;
- 2 Wilkinson's Fowington Tweed with Hurwyn, very feminine bitch of quality, it was a hard decision between top two placings but I just preferred the expression of 1;
- 3 McManus' Crookrise Moondance.

OPEN BITCH (10,4)

1 Turnbull's Juenerfly Angelica at Beridew, compact & symmetrical b/w of quality, shown in excellent condition. This bitch moved with purpose, correct in angulation, depth of brisket & spring of rib, she is a feminine bitch with all the qualities you would expect from a working dog, CC & RBIS;

2 McManus' Crookrise Arran at Luneville, lightly marked o/w, mature body with depth & correct angulation, lovely neck & shoulders, moved with drive using her tail;

3 Edmondson's Crookrise White Lace.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS BITCH (2)

1 Ward's Burslygrange Pretty Lady, this bitch has a feminine head with kind gentle expression, good angulation & movement.

BRACE (1)

1 Nelis' Fowington Bruar of Freebreeze & Freebreeze Reflected Glory, praise goes to the handler for excellent handling techniques.
